Almost 40 million motorcycles, mopeds, tricycles and quadricycles are used on Europe's roads, supporting clean, efficient and fun mobility. Overall, the motorcycle sector and its activities contribute around €21.4 billion to European GDP and account for 389,000 jobs across all member states.

Inclusion in EU Strategic Mobility and Transport Policies

ACEM, FEMA and FIM encourage the EU institutions to include motorcycles (and the wider L-category) in future initiatives covering vehicle, user and infrastructure to enhance safety and capture the benefits of this lighter and more efficient form of transport.
